### 7. Charter Staff Reports

- A. Leadership Summit The Leadership Summit overall went very well. Sixth graders completed a CSI Me project. They demonstrated their leadership skills by developing and leading a geocaching event for Fox River Academy 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders. The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders led a Leadership Summit, covering the 7 Habits, at two different schools. Each group taught up to six sessions in a day. The students did really well and received many compliments. They demonstrated how they learned from each presentation time and improved and adjusted for the next presentation.
- B. Upcoming project focus and core schedule Upcoming project will be Social Studies standards with Comm Arts. The project will be focused on US Government and will incorporate the theme of Leaders of the World. Mr. Hall will be working on the core class of science, specifically Life Science and Space.
- C. DPI school report cards FWA did not get a report card this year because the DPI need "past 3 years" of data for the evaluation and FWA does not have that yet. FWA test scores were provided as part of HMS. HASD as a district did very well.
- D. Staff provided a summary of the feedback from the October presentation to the HASD Board of Education.
