It's been six weeks since his transplant, and Randy feels awesome. His doctors say he's recovering fine. Randy's family includes: two sons named Brandon and Colby, a daughter named Tabatha, his wife Jan, two dogs named Mac and Remy, two cats named Smokey and Bandit, and horses.
