Student Timeline Project

The student timeline project is a fun way to introduce the use of timelines. It will help you see that timelines are a shorthand way to organize information and to keep track of when events occur and see how much history has taken place during your life.

Your Project: Create a timeline of your own life. Each timeline should include a minimum **10 dates of personal events** and **5 dates of National and/or World Wide Events with a short 1 sentence or less description**. There should be a minimum of **5 pictures** highlighting some of these events. **DUE: Wednesday October 26th** at the beginning of class.

Your Grade: This assignment is worth 30 points. A timeline that has 15 dates, is neat and easy to read, and uses at least 5 pictures will earn a 3. Try to make it colorful and visually appealing. Points will be deducted if your timeline is missing any dates, descriptions, pictures, or is turned in after the due date. You will also be graded on your neatness and creativity. You may print information from a computer, but your timeline will be drawn on a piece of paper (using a ruler).

****Tips****

1. Events on timeline must be **spaced appropriately** and have a description. (description should show you know what the event was)
2. Try to keep personal events and world events separate in some way (Organization)
3. Put your name on your timeline and a title
4. Pictures should be connected to or placed near the event (**ask parents before using personal photos)
