POLICY STATEMENT:

The School District of Hortonville shall require safety practices and procedures within the school classrooms and laboratories that are appropriate for the learning atmosphere, acceptable as an established safety procedure and enforceable by a supervisor.

RATIONALE:

SCOPE:

All students of the School District of Hortonville

RESPONSIBILITY:

Compliance with this policy shall be the responsibility of the District Safety Coordinator

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. Safety Glasses

All students, instructors and visitors must wear approved safety goggles or glasses (stamped on glasses with A.N.S.I code 287.1-1968) under the following conditions:

When using machinery in the woodworking shop, metals shop, power mechanics shop, light building construction shop, or middle school shop, and when in these areas if machinery is in operation; when in science laboratories using and/or exposed to dangerous chemicals or flames or when in these areas if dangerous chemicals or flames are being used; when in the art rooms using buffing wheels or using torches, and in all other instances as common sense indicates.

2. Hair and Clothing

Any student using machinery, including office equipment or chemicals must have long hair securely covered or tied. Bows, neckties, long neck chains, rings, bracelets, coats and other types of loose clothing are to be removed when working with the above.

3. Aprons

All students when working in the laboratory area of the chemistry room, must wear aprons approved by the instructor in charge.

4. Safety Equipment

All safety equipment required to be worn by students must be purchased by the student whenever it is not provided by the school.

5. Failure to comply will result in disciplinary action.
