Course Goal- Students will learn map skills by interpreting a variety of maps. Students will locate countries, cities and geographical features worldwide, specifically and relatively. Students will examine the five themes of geography and the seven elements of culture. Students will learn how their lives are directly related with people around the globe. Students will examine how past conflicts have shaped the world around them today. Students will gain an understanding of cultures from around the globe.

Introduction- Cultural geography is the study of cultural and physical diversities within world cultures. The topography, culture, history, politics, religions, economies and currents events of each of the following areas will be examined. These areas include: The Middle East, China, South Asia, and the Former Soviet Union.

Course Outline

The Middle East (8 weeks)

(Islam, Women & Islam, Terrorism, Stereotypes, US Middle East Policy, Iraq, Iran, Saudi Arabia, Israel & Palestine)

Unit 3 "China" (3-4 weeks)

(History, Rise of Communism & WWII, Communist Effects today, China in the world today, Impact of China's Economy)

Unit 4 "South Asia" (3-4 weeks)

(History, Religions & Philosophy, Caste System, Gandhi, Hindu Muslim Conflict, India & Pakistan today, Afghanistan)

Unit 5 "The Former Soviet Union" (3-4 weeks)

(Era of the Czar, Rise of Communism, Impact of Lenin & Stalin, Collapse of USSR, Russia in the world today)

Unit Structure-

- 1. 35% Tests and Quizzes Scores will be based on objective tests from the readings, lectures, class materials, and map activities.
- 2. 25% Assignments and Class Activities Scores will be based on total points from assignments, homework, and class activities.
- 3. 20% Projects Scores will be based on total scores from unit projects.
