I can identify adverbs of frequency.

Adverbs of frequency are used to say how often a person does a certain activity.

In addition to knowing what each term means, there are some rules about where each is placed in a sentence. We have the same rules in English.

Which sounds better?

I do my always homework. OR I always do my homework.

There are some “tricks” to help you remember where to place various adverbs of frequency in Spanish.

- The first three (Siempre, Nunca, and Rara vez) are placed directly before the verb.

- The other six can be placed either at the beginning or at the end

of a sentence, but **NEVER** in the middle of a sentence!
