"Variety is the spice of life"

What are things that are good to have a variety of?

Jelly bean flavors, m & m colors, donuts, marker colors, daily schedules, etc.

Just like variety is good with foods, art, activities, etc., it's also good to vary sentence structure in your paragraphs and essays. Otherwise, your writing will get too dull or too complicated for your reader.

Today, you will learn how to vary sentence structure when you write your essays.

4 Types of Sentences

1.Simple: A simple sentence consists of a subject and a predicate. They are easy to write and understand. Too many simple sentences, however, produces choppy writing and simple thoughts and ideas.

Example: "The dog barked."

2.Compound: A compound sentence contains two simple sentences joined by a comma and a conjunction.

Example: "The dog barked, and the cat yowled."

3.Complex: A complex sentence contains a simple sentence with clauses attached.

Example: "The dog that was in the street howled loudly."

4.Compound-Complex: As the name implies a compound-complex sentence combines a complex sentence with a simple sentence.

Example: "As the dog howled, one cat sat on the fence, and the other licked its paws."
