Mock Trial	<p>6-10 students in grades 9-12 Designed to give students a better idea of how the legal system works by requiring them to put together a legal case proposed by the Wisconsin Bar Association, the governing board for lawyers practicing in the state. Participation requires students interested in acting as lawyers and/or witnesses. Team members work together to prepare questions for witnesses, opening and closing arguments and questions for cross examination of their "opponents" witnesses. The district competition is held in February at the Outagamie County Courthouse. If the team wins district competition, it then competes in Regional and State competitions. Late October—February.
