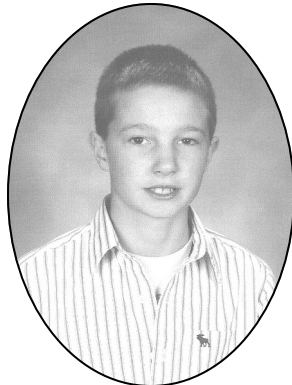

FOOD DRIVE REMEMBERS "DEWEY" GMS and GES WORKING TOGETHER



Greenville Middle School along with Greenville Elementary School will again be collecting canned goods, packaged goods, and paper products for the needy starting December 5 to December 19. The food drive, in its nineteenth year, was designated as "Dewey's GMS/GES Food Drive for the Needy". Duane "Dewey" Ashauer, who passed away in October 2007 as the result of a tragic

farm accident, was a student at both GMS and GES. While only 13 years old, Dewey will long be remembered as a person who loved to help others.

GMS and GES are the largest one time contributors to the Hortonville/Dale Food Pantry. Since 1993 the Greenville school community has donated 89,694 items to the pantry. To date, this amount is estimated at somewhere around 22 tons of canned and packed items. "We would be in serious trouble trying to help feed the area needy if it wasn't for Greenville's donations", stated Jim Garon of the Hortonville/Dale Food Pantry. He went on to say that "the Food Pantry regularly serves 170 families and will serve over 200 around the

holidays." Last year's 8,546 donated items was the third largest annual contribution ever for GES and GMS. The GMS Student Council (SALSA) will again be overseeing the collection this year for both schools.

From December 5 until December 19, students and community members can bring canned and nonperishable food (baby items and paper products are also welcome) items to either school. Any help you can give us would be greatly appreciated. If you have something you would like to contribute and cannot get it to a school, please feel free to contact Bruce A. WKCE TESTS NOVEMBER 7 - 18

The Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Examinations—Criterion Referenced Test (WKCE-CRT) is a statewide testing program designed to provide information about what students in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10 know in core academic areas.

The WKCE-CRT for grades 3 through 8 and 10 measures achievement in reading and mathematics, using multiple-choice and short-answer questions. The WKCE-CRT for grades 4, 8, and 10 also measures achievement in language arts, science, social studies and writing.

The total time required for the administration of the tests varies by grade and may range from 5 to 8 1/2 hours. Testing is spread out over several days. More comprehensive information about the WKCE-CRT will be mailed home prior to the test.

Report Cards are handed out at Parent/Teacher Conferences on Nov. 9, 10, and 11. If you are unable to attend the dates, the office will mail report cards out the following week.
