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## Reading Workshop

Reading Workshop is a block of time (about an hour) which involves a number of components. The components during the workshop may include the following items:

- \*Book Talk
- \*Mini Lesson
- \*Independent Reading
  - \*Student/teacher conferencing
  - \*Reader’s notebook letter
- \*Guided Reading
- \*Literature Study
- \*Group Share



Reading levels for third grade range from a level L in the beginning of the year to a level P at the end of the year.

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## Writing Workshop

**Writer's Workshop builds students' writing through continuous, repeated exposure to the process of writing.**

### Elements of the Writing Process Workshop

- \* Students keep a notebook or folder to organize their “in progress” writing.
- \* Class members are at different points in their writing. Some may be prewriting while others are at an editing stage.
- \* The teacher’s role is that of a facilitator: monitoring, encouraging, conferencing, and providing help as needed.
- \* Students seek response to their writing through peer editing and make changes to improve their writing.
- \* Instruction is provided to various-sized groups based upon student needs.
- \* Students have time to orally share their written pieces.
- \* Teachers use conferencing to coach students through writing process.
- \* The teacher meets with individual students to conference about their writing throughout the process.
- \* The Writing Workshop follows a predictable pattern of a 5-10 minute mini-lesson on a timely writing technique, least 30 minutes for the workshop’s main business of writing and conferring, and 5-10 minutes for the concluding group-share session.





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## Mathematics

Math in third grade builds on concepts learned in second grade and challenges students to be self-motivated problem solvers.



Concepts this year include:

- Place Value to 100,000
- Counting and computing money
- Addition to the thousands with regrouping with more than two numbers
- Subtraction with regrouping to numbers in the thousands
- Multiplication facts and concepts
- Fact to twelve
- Division facts and concepts
- Time to the minute, elapsed time
- Graphs and collecting data
- Measurement (metric and standard) weight, capacity, length, mass
- Geometry
- Fractions
- Decimals
- Probability

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## Science-Health

The units that we cover in Third Grade Science are:

Living Things  
Ecosystems  
Earth & It's Resources  
Weather & Space  
The Physics of Sound

We use the Scientific Method to help us guide our hands on science activities.

**Problem:** What are we looking to do/find out?

**Hypothesis:** Formulate a statement that we can test (If...then...)

**Experiment:** We design a way to test our hypothesis.

**Observation:** We observe our experiment with all of our senses and record the data.

**Conclusion:** Drawing conclusions is important, was our hypothesis supported by the experiment?
