The Hortonville Area School District serves student and families within the communities of Hortonville, Greenville, along with parts of Center, Dale, Ellington, Grand Chute, Hortonia, and Liberty. The district maintains six school buildings on three campuses, home to nearly 5,000 students.

Students entering Hortonville High School (HHS) come from the District's two public middle schools, as well as three local private schools. HHS serves 1,326 students in grades 9 through 12, and offers a rigorous high school curriculum within a hybrid block schedule. Polar Bear athletes participate in the FVA Athletic Conference.

The Village of Hortonville is a vibrant community of 2,745 residents located in southwestern Outagamie County, an area known as the Fox River Valley.

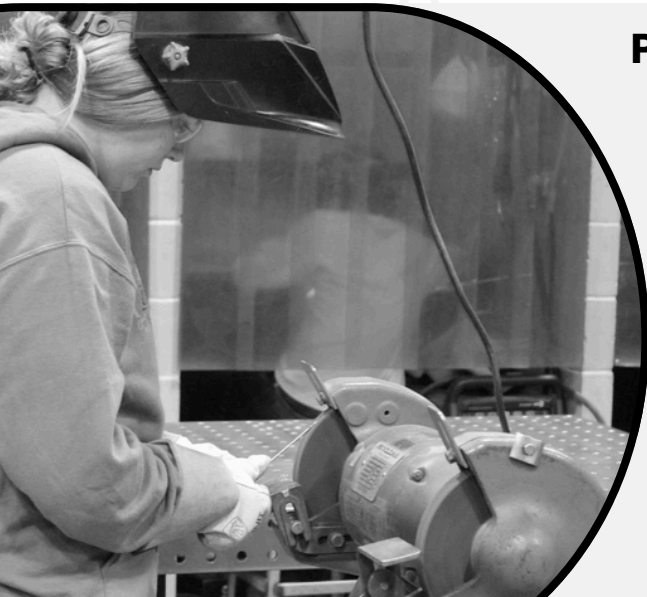

MENTAL WELLNESS

In addition to diverse academic opportunities, HHS offers several programs to support students' emotional needs and wellbeing, such as Link Crew, which aids in the transition from middle school to high school for 9th graders; Sources of Strength, a youth suicide prevention project designed to harness the power of peer social networks to change unhealthy norms and culture, ultimately preventing suicide, bullying and substance abuse; and onsite access to professional licensed therapists through the E3 Program.
