


2023-2024 PARENT PROGRAMS

Student must be enrolled in 3 credits during the semester

Student must maintain passing grades in all classes

Student has completed 36 service hours for seniors and 27 service hours for juniors

Student will have no attendance issues

Student will have no discipline referrals

Student will have no school parking violations

Student will still be required to return for some school sponsored events



ACT PREP CLASS

Hortonville High School will once again be a host site for an ACT Prep class. The class is geared toward all Juniors to help prepare them for the ACT test on March 12. The four-day course includes: two days of direct instruction, one full-length practice exam with scoring, and one final day dedicated to additional review of materials and practice examples.

The class will be held Monday, February 26 through Thursday, February 29, 2023, from 4:00-7:15 p.m. The cost of the class is \$130 or with a writing sample \$160. There are a few seats remaining, and spots are filled on a first come first served basis. There are other class sites available if these dates at Hortonville do not work for you. REQUESTING TRANSCRIPTS

Seniors applying to colleges should request their transcripts either through Xello or our newest platform, ScribOrder. Xello is an Internet-based career exploration and planning tool to explore career and college options and develop a career plan. Xello can be accessed from school, home, or wherever students have access to the Internet. There are many tools available for Academic and Career Planning. Instructions for sending a transcript are available on the HHS website under Academics/Counseling | Transcripts.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A list of scholarships, received from outside sources, is compiled, and updated weekly. The list, which contains information regarding the amount, application criteria and deadlines, is posted on the HHS website under Academics/Counseling | Scholarships & Financial Aid.

FINANCIAL AID

According to the Federal Student Aid website, there were major changes and improvements to the 2024-25 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form. This redesigned and streamlined FAFSA form became available December 31, 2023. All the directions and forms are available on https://studentaid.gov/. Your college's financial aid office is also a great source of information and assistance. Another great source for assistance with the FAFSA is Mike Gawel, Fox Valley Tech Financial Aid Facilitator, who presented for the FAFSA Parent Night. He can assist with FAFSA questions whether your student is attending a four-year college or a technical college.

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
