Attendance Matters!

As we move along in 2nd semester, we want to remind you of the importance of daily school attendance. If your child is healthy, please ensure they come to school every day. Each school day provides valuable learning time and opportunities to connect with teachers and peers.

HASD allows up to 10 excused absences per year. After the 10th absence, a doctor's note will be required for any further absences to be excused. Any unexcused absences may lead to a truancy referral and citation.

Consistent attendance is crucial for student success. Missing even a couple of days each month can result in falling behind in school. If your child is struggling with attendance, we are here to help. Please reach out for support and resources.

Tardies: Students arriving late (15 minutes or less) will be marked tardy. More than 15 minutes late will be an unexcused absence. Students with repeated tardies will receive lunch or after-school detention.


