Attendance Matters!

As we move along in 2nd semester, we want to remind you of the importance of daily school attendance. If your child is healthy, please ensure they come to school every day. Each school day provides valuable learning time and opportunities to connect with teachers and peers.

HASD allows up to 10 excused absences per year. After the 10th absence, a doctor's note will be required for any further absences to be excused. Any unexcused absences may lead to a truancy referral and citation.

START COLLEGE NOW AND EARLY COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAM

Applications for Start College Now and Early College Credit Program classes for the 2025 Fall semester are due no later than **Monday, March 3, 2025 at 3:45 pm**. Applications are available outside the Counseling Office and on the Counseling website under Dual Enrollment/College Coursework. Information on the Dual Enrollment programs is also available on this site. *Please note: If your student is taking CAPP, AP, or TC classes here at the high school, they do not need to fill out Start College Now or ECCP paperwork. This paperwork is only if the student is attending a technical college or UW college for a class or doing an online class through these schools.

YOUTH SERVICE LEARNING HOURS


