Willkommen! The four skills in a language (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) will be used on a daily basis to help you practice and learn vocabulary and grammar.

Classroom Expectations:

- Students are to come to class prepared to study and speak German. Bring your workbook, writing utensil, and handbook with you every day.
- Students are to demonstrate respect for all individuals, cultures, and beliefs.
- Students are to follow all school rules and Behavioral Standards.
- Students are to do no homework other than German in class.
- Cheating will NOT be tolerated. Cheating includes translation programs, plagiarism, excessive help from advanced students or native speakers, and any other resources other than those approved by the teacher.
- Phone must be silenced and out of sight or they will be confiscated.

Standards Based Grading: Using a language is a **skill** which must be developed with practice. You will be offered an abundance of opportunities to practice the language, but it is up to **YOU** to make that practice worthwhile. Proficiency feedback on homework, activities and assessments will be provided using a 4-point scale and all events under each learning target will be averaged by Skyward; so every event is important. At the end of the semester, I will grade by mode for each learning targets. This means, that you can have a 2 in a learning target and still receive an A for the course. I want to see more 3s and 4s than 2s. Re-assessing, when possible, will help you in the long run.

Learning Targets for World Languages

1. I can engage in conversation in the target language.

This skill will be assessed with an INTERPERSONAL performance assessment (spontaneous speaking in pairs or groups). This is a summative assessment and cannot be redone.

2. I can understand and interpret the target language in its written and spoken form.

This skill will be assessed with an INTERPRETIVE reading and listening performance assessment. Some of these can be re-assessed.

3. I can create an original spoken or written message.

This skill will be assessed with an ORAL or WRITTEN PRESENTATIONAL performance assessment (prepared, practiced, polished). This is a summative assessment and cannot be redone. When grading, I'm looking more at content. I want to see your ideas and your ability to express them the best you can with the grammar skills that you have.

4. I can demonstrate correct usage of target language structures.

This skill will be assessed with grammar quizzes. **Grammar quiz re-takes are permitted when homework, online** practice, and in class activities are completed. Re-assessments can only score a 3 for the highest.

Performance on the final exam may impact your final semester grade: your grade could stay the same, go half a grade higher, or half a grade lower.
