There are multiple words in Spanish for each English possessive term because these are possessive ADJECTIVES. You know that in Spanish, adjectives must agree in number and gender with the noun they modify. Therefore, we need different possessive adjectives to express ownership of masculine/feminine/singular/plural nouns.
