Welcome to an exciting new school year! We in the World Language Department are eager to work with your child to continue developing his/her language abilities.



We would like to take this opportunity to share some **important information about 7th grade World Language** since your child's achievement this year impacts the choices that he or she will have regarding the continuation of Spanish or German during 8th grade.

A few important things to know about 7th grade World Language....

- 7th grade is the last year in which students in HASD are **required** to study a World Language. (It is optional in 8th grade and beyond.)
- The 7th grade World Language curriculum begins introducing students to concepts traditionally taught in a first-year high school level course. Classes at this level become a bit more academic (less exploratory) in nature. Beginning in 7th grade, it is very important for students to start building a foundation of key language concepts to ensure a smooth progression to the next level language class.
- 8th grade World Language courses are a continuation of 7th grade. The 8th grade curriculum includes higher level content and moves at a more rapid pace. As such, demonstrating proficiency with 7th grade concepts is a pre-requisite for enrollment in 8th grade World Language.
- At the end of this school year, your child's Spanish or German teacher will make a recommendation regarding placement into 8th grade World Language.

Recommendations will be **based on** several factors, including:

- o positive classroom involvement (practice work / life skills)
- mastery of World Language standards throughout the year
 (World Language Standards are shown in the chart on the back side of this letter. Those marked with an asterisk (*) are 7th grade World Language Power Standards. <u>All</u> students must demonstrate Mastery in these Power Standards by the end of the year to successfully complete 7th grade World Language.

Students wishing to progress to 8th grade World Language must consistently demonstrate Mastery in **all** standards listed, both Power and non-Power Standards.)

Essential Skills post-test
 (This assessment is an additional tool designed to gauge student proficiency with key 7th grade concepts. It will be administered as a pre- and post-test during the 7th grade year.)
