

La conjugación

F.O.L. #2: If you want to put an infinitive with a "WHO"
conjugation you must do!

A few important definitions....

- infinitive: a VERB in its -ar, -er or -ir form, def'n begins w/ "to"

- conjugation: changing an infinitive so it "goes with" the subject (or subject pronoun)

Remember...

subject
(pronoun) + infinitive

Steps for Conjugating Verbs

☆ **cross out the infinitive ending**

☆ **put the "stem" in every room**

☆ **add "furniture" for every room**

stem → **llevar** = to wear

talking "ABOUT"	1 st person	yo	llev o	nosotros nosotras	llev amos
		tú	llev as	vosotros vosotras	llev áis
talking "TO"	2 nd person	usted (Ud.)	llev a	ustedes (Uds.)	llev an
		él ella		ellos ellas	
talking "ABOUT"	3 rd person				
			Singular	Plural	

Key things to remember:

A subject or subject pronoun CANNOT be immediately followed by an infinitive.

EVERY regular verb in the Spanish language will follow this conjugation pattern (the 3 steps).

EVERY regular -AR verb in the Spanish language will use this furniture pattern (endings).
