

GUSTAR (parte 2)

The next thing we need to learn about the verb "gustar" is that we can use it to talk about what **other people** like and dislike.

→To do this we still use two forms of gustar: gusta and gustan.

→However, we don't use subject pronouns (yo, tú, él, etc.); we use an indirect object pronoun.

Indirect object pronoun				
To say that I like something...	(No)	me	gusta	infinitive or singular noun
To say (or ask if) YOU like something [informal]...		te		
To say HE or SHE likes something.... To say (or ask if) YOU like something [formal]...		* le	gustan	plural noun

Let's try it....

1. I don't like to skate. No me gusta patinar.
2. Do you like the sweater? ¿Te gusta el suéter?
3. She likes the shoes. Le gustan los zapatos.
