

Los artículos indefinidos

Often we use words called articles in front of a noun.

As with definite articles, there are 4 indefinite articles in Spanish.



Indefinite articles are more general than definite articles. When a person asks for an unspecific item they use the indefinite article.

Ej: Can I borrow a pencil, please?

Also, when describing the clothes that you are wearing, it is more natural to use the indefinite article.

Ej: When I ski, I wear a coat, a hat, and (some) gloves.

Because F.O.L. #1.

All nouns have number and gender.

The singular indefinite articles mean a / an;

The plural indefinite articles mean some.

<u>a(an)/some</u>	<u>masculino</u>	<u>femenino</u>
singular	un	una
plural	unos	unas

Note: Remember, as long as a group has at least one male member, the masculine plural article is used.
