Welcome to Spanish class! My name is **Ms. Krizizke**, but it might be easier to just call me **Señora**. I am happy to have the opportunity to work with you and I'm looking forward to an exciting and productive semester. This document outlines **6th grade Spanish class policies and procedures** so that you will know how to be **SUCCESSFUL** and get the most out of our time together. Use this information as a reference throughout the school year.



WHAT DO I NEED FOR THIS CLASS?

1. A three-ring binder in which to store your **SPANISH** materials. (1/2" or 1")

2. 10-15 sheets of **PAPER** for notes and class work – (*either a notebook or loose-leaf*).

3. A **WRITING UTENSIL** of some sort (*pencil, pen – any color is fine*)

4. A CORRECTING PEN (a <u>different</u> color than you plan to complete your work in)
5. Your ASSIGNMENT NOTEBOOK
****BRING THESE ITEMS TO CLASS EVERY DAY!!****

WHAT IS 6TH GRADE SPANISH LIKE?

Even though students are in this building for 5th grade, 6th grade is when 'middle school' officially begins. In middle school, students are expected to take on more responsibility for their learning, including bringing necessary supplies from class to class. (*see above*)

6th grade Spanish also begins middle school level Spanish, and it is a little **DIFFERENT** than Spanish classes in grades 2-5. While still part of the "exploratory" rotation, middle school Spanish classes serve as a stepping stone between elementary school work and more academic high school level Spanish.

You should expect this Spanish class to be a little more **CHALLENGING** than previous years. It is a 'level up'. We will take different kinds of assessments and **you will need to study** and **put forth effort** both in AND outside of class. Don't worry though, we will do lots of practice activities to build your skills – you will do **GREAT**!



WHAT IF I'M ABSENT?

In the event of an absence, it is the <u>student's</u> responsibility to obtain missed assignments and notes and be ready to continue learning the next class period. Waiting until the next class to ask the teacher, "What did I miss?" is something students should NOT do.

There are a couple good ways to get caught up from an absence. You could (A) **check with a dependable classmate** to find out what was covered in Spanish and what kind of practice you missed. We will NEVER do "nothing" in class – so if someone tells you that, ask another student!

You could also (B) **use resources on Canvas** that show class activities and practice work so you can keep learning when you are away from the classroom. We will spend some time learning how to access & use these resources very soon.

Once you find out what happened in class, **complete the lesson you missed** and any related **practice work** as soon as possible. It is a good idea to submit your work to the teacher so that you can receive feedback and be sure that you are on-track with learning targets and fully prepared for upcoming assessments.

If you need further assistance, see me before or after class, or we can set a time to meet before/after school or during WIN.

Students missing school for vacation should request work before leaving; it will be due upon your return.

HOW WILL MY 'GRADE' BE DETERMINED?



Your **academic grade** will be based on <u>assessments</u> of World Language standards – this is where you show what you have mastered.

You will also have a **SEAL skills grade** (Social-Emotional & Academic Learning behaviors) We will discuss how your learning efforts will be monitored, summarized, and reported out.
