## **GUSTAR** (parte 3)

We know that we need TWO forms of the verb gustar to express likes/dislikes:

gusta and gustan

We also know that we can use the verb "gustar" with indirect object pronouns (me, te, le) to talk about what other people like and dislike.

The next thing we need to learn about "gustar" is that we can add prepositional pronouns to

emphasize <sub>or</sub> clarify whose opinions are being stated. prepositional indirect object pronoun pronoun me A Emphasis Never use infinitive "vo" or "tú" gusta singular in a *gusta* :A te statement! noun (no) usted A él Clarification A ella \* le plural A qustan noun

The statement "Le gusta la gorra." could mean THREE things:

A

(name)

- You (formal) like the hat. (usted)
  - He likes the hat. (él)
  - She likes the hat. (ella)

We need to add "A" and a prepositional pronoun to CLARIFY exactly whose opinion is being expressed.
