

# los gustos

We use the verb **GUSTAR** when we want to say that someone likes something.

(But I remember my Spanish teacher saying that GUSTAR was a "weird" verb ... why?)

→ Because we only use two forms of the verb: gusta & gustan

→ And because when expressing likes in Spanish, the sentence structure is "backwards" compared to English.

(You're not really saying someone likes an item or an activity; you're saying "The item/activity is pleasing to someone

Plural items ARE pleasing to someone.")

So how do I build this "interesting" sentence structure???
