We use the verb GUSTAR when we want to say that someone _____ something.

But I remember my Spanish teacher saying that GUSTAR was a weird verb ... why?

→ Because we only use these two forms of the verb: **gusta** & **gustan**

→ Because instead of SUBJECTS (yo, tú, él, nosotros, etc.) we use **INDIRECT OBJECT PRONOUNS.**

* Remember that before the **LE** and **LES**, we need to indicate our subject by adding **A + SUBJECT**.

A Juan le gusta bailar.

Juan likes to dance.

☆ For emphasis, we can add a **prepositional pronoun**. In most cases, these are the same as subject pronouns. Two exceptions: yo → mí AND tú → ti

A mí, me gusta el verano.

Me? I like summer.
