

# Adjective Agreement

Another VERY important concept in Spanish is....

What does this mean?

- We know that adjectives are used to describe or modify nouns.
- Since nouns in Spanish have number and gender,  
the adjectives that describe the nouns must “agree” or match.

Many of you may have already learned (3) adjective agreement patterns.

<b>O</b>	masculino	Femenino
singular	<b>feo</b>	<b>fea</b>
plural	<b>feos</b>	<b>feas</b>

<b>E</b>	masculino	femenino
singular	<b>grande</b>	<b>grande</b>
plural	<b>grandes</b>	<b>grandes</b>

<b>CONSONANTE</b>	masculino	femenino
singular	<b>azul</b>	<b>azul</b>
plural	<b>azules</b>	<b>azules</b>



Adjectives in Spanish are usually placed AFTER the noun.
