## Cultural Fact:

In Spanish speaking countries the weekly calendar always begins with "lunes" (Monday).

<b>¿Qué día es hoy?</b> <b>What day is today?</b>	Hoy es... <b>Today is...</b>
<b>¿Qué día es mañana?</b> <b>What day is tomorrow?</b>	Mañana es... <b>Tomorrow is...</b>

## Cultural Fact:

To say on a certain day of the week, use "el".  
Ex: *El viernes* = On Friday

To say on a certain day every week, use "los".  
Ex: *Los martes* = Every Tuesday
