Stem Changing Verbs

A.K.A. Boot Verbs



I can conjugate stem-changing verbs.

When you see an **Infinitive** followed by **letters in parenthesis**, it shows that you are dealing with a **stem changing verb**. Ex: cerrar (ie)


<u>Stem changing verbs</u> conjugate just like regular verbs, with one extra little twist. Let's review the steps for conjugating a regular –AR, -ER, or –IR verb.

- 1. Cross off the infinitive (-ar / -er / -ir) ending
 - Change the stem
- 2. Bring down the stem with boot changes
- 3. Add the ending for who is doing the action

Now for the extra twist—it comes between step 1 and 2. Add it to your notes above. As the name of these verbs

suggests, you Change the stem (but only in 4 of the 6 forms).
