Math Corner

We began our fact routines. You will find that your child has an envelope in their binder with 10 fact cards. These fact cards will be assessed on Thursdays. Students will receive the "next level" multiplication facts after they received a 10/10 in the 45 second assessment. Students may practice facts in any way they wish. I have MANY resources to practice that are fun and engaging. For now, have them practice as they see. In the next few weeks watch for an email from me with additional resources to practice. I have found your child's instructional fact level. Some ideas for practice include: writing repeated addition, drawing arrays, writing the two multiplication and two division facts that go with that fact family. EX: 2x5=10, 5x2=10, 10/2=5, 10/5=2. We also learned how to break apart and write the distributive property which concluded our week. Next week we'll be focusing on: products with as a factor, 6,7,8 and 9 as factors, multiplying three numbers, and multiplication patterns within numbers.



Writer's Workshop

We kicked off the week with our New Year's goal setting. Students answered these questions: What are your New Year's resolutions or what are your goals for the New Year?


