
Dear Editor:

Top Amusement Parks to Visit

There are over 500 amusement parks nationwide, but only a couple are ranked the absolute best. See which ones have five stars, and get an average of 71,000,000 visitors yearly. There might be one near you!

Utopia is one of the most outrageous amusement parks ever built! Not only does it include rides and swimming, but has an ice cream buffet where you can create your own ice cream dessert. The toppings include chopped nuts, marshmallows, chocolate, caramel, cherry, and strawberry syrup, sprinkles, Oreos, cookie dough, candy bars, and much more! You can then enter a contest to have your very own creation become a menu item at the snack bar.

Besides the food, the roller coasters are some of the most artistically built, from upside-down to driving through fountains of chocolate. You can get your picture taken with you covered head-to-toe in chocolate after the ride! Another exciting place to visit in Utopia is the caramel swimming pool. The Relaxation Pool is an oversized swimming pool packed with fish, turtles, dolphins, and sting rays. Being twelve feet deep, it is a good idea to watch small children at all times. The animals are all safe to be swim with, so scuba diving gear is available to rent for the day. Visiting Roaring Waves is a great way to make memories with your family.

Wonder Waters gets rated five stars by the most persnickety critics. Again, this is mostly a water park. It has amusing rides such as the Twisty. The entire ride, you go in circles and get water sprayed all over you. You can get your picture taken with Wonder Waters mascot, Drippy-Drop the water droplet.

Every person who visits Maxed out Fun! gets a t-shirt designed by other kids who have been there.

Over 9,000,000 people go to Maxed out Fun! annually. Not one person who has been there gave a rating below four stars! What makes Maxed out Fun! so great? H²O Explode, located in Wild Waters Amusement Park, gives you the thrill of your life! It is one of the first roller coasters to go underwater, and it also has 360 degree turns with up to 500 foot drops.


The Corkscrew x7, located in Fun Land Amusement Park, is extremely terrifying! It takes you through 7 corkscrew loops nonstop all in one row, making you extremely dizzy. This rollercoaster may give you the most extreme 1 minute and 5 seconds of your entire life!

Sky Rocket, located in Mountain Extreme Amusement Park, is just like it sounds. It brings you up a slow 150 feet and drops back down at up to 75 M.P.H. It also has amazingly large triple loops with constant turns and jerks; you never know where you are going!

Horizontal Velocity, located in 12 Flags Amusement Park, is a one-of-a-kind ride. You ride on your side the whole time, as the cars speed up to 100 M.P.H. while moving from one end to the other end along a 100 foot horizontal track. There is a jerking stop at the end of the track each time before it races back to the other end.





Safety on a Roller Coaster

While riding on a roller coaster there are rules you have to follow. Some rules are just common sense and some rules are not so common but still very important. Safety on a roller coaster or any other ride is one of the most important rules of riding. The second is having fun!

The second story shows that you could get very injured from even a kiddie ride if you don't follow all the safety rules. Also, if you didn't catch it, the son of the injured woman saw it all; if I was the son I would be so very terrified and scared for my mother's life. So from my stories you should interpret that roller coaster safety is so important and that you should always expect the unexpected.

Roller Coaster Review

The Exhilaration Nation Theme Park is in the process of making a new addition to its already thrilling expanse of rides. The new ride is deemed "The United States' Economy." The building of this thrill ride started in December of 2007, and has been a work in progress since that time. "The United States' Economy" features countless twists, turns, and frequent stomachwrenching ups and downs.


Although the ride isn't quite finished, the park offered a special sneakpeak that included three quarters the length that the ride will actually be. A unique feature to this ride is that it contains a timeline; there are many sections, each with its own unique feel. Each of these sections is labeled with a year, starting with 2007. The idea for this ride came from a top executive at the coaster building company "Turn of Events." This coaster company built many other popular rides such as: The Vomit Comet, Gravity in Space, Extreme 2 , The Summit, and The End of the World as You Know It. The launching of "The United States' Economy" has made the company "Turn of Events" a household name in the roller coaster industry.

The beginning of "The United States' Economy" features an amazing 1,000 feet-high climb. When reaching the top, the first marking in the timeline is clearly visible. As you approach "December, 2007" you can see the heart-pounding drop straight down. Before you can even react, the cars plummet towards the ground and crash into the track at the bottom. The next few time periods feature many confusing twists, turns, and even have you heading backwards at times! After the confusion, you will start to notice a slight incline, followed by minor ups and downs. As you reach "January 2013" the track starts to become very unstable and rickety. Fog blocks the next length of the track, and no one knows what will happen next. Finally as you travel through a mist of uncertainties, you see that it's not that bad, even though there are many mixed reactions from the riders. Periodic inclines and declines are all involved; nothing new. The last and final section of the ride is labeled "Late 2013-Early 2014." The ride continues at a slow and steady pace, sluggish almost. You're curious as to what this section will bring, and realize there is another sign there, too. It reads "To Be Determined." And that's when the bottom drops out from underneath you.

The people there are so nice and polite, and if you do a little on-line searching, you can often find some great admission deals. If you plan on spending more than one day at Swirly's, no problem! Swirly's also has thousands of hotel rooms located next to the park.

Swirly's has a little something for everyone. They have over three hundred roller coasters and over one hundred water rides. If you prefer shopping, then hit the on-site mall. Swirly's Mall has hundreds of stores and specialty shops. Don't forget to buy some awesome Swirly's Amusement Park clothing and merchandise.

In addition to hundreds of great rides, Swirly's also has a petting zoo where you can pet hundreds of animals and feed them. They have goats, geese, ducks, cows, a donkey, and horses. And every two hours they also have all your favorite cartoon characters come out for a meet-and-greet and you can get your picture taken with them.

Swirly's has hundreds of awesome roller coasters, and I would like to review a few of them, starting with the Loopy Loop. From the first time I tried the Loopy Loop, I loved it. It was adrenaline-rushing and heartpounding. This awesome roller coaster had six loops in a row, sharp turns, and a 3,000 foot drop. When I went on this ride it was amazing. I was scared at first, but by the end I had a blast. The loops made you dizzy but the drop was the best part. When the roller coaster went down my stomach felt like it was dropping. And when it reached the bottom, it entered a tunnel and snapped a photo, so always remember to smile! I loved this ride and how much fun it was.

I also loved the Swirl. The Swirl is a ride that goes really fast and is shaped like the letter "U". It goes up on one side of the "U", then drops down and goes up the other side. This ride also made my stomach drop and was very exciting.


Swirly's is in the process of building a new coaster called The Great Leap. This ride will be a very scary ride. On this ride you go up a huge hill and drop straight down 5,000 feet to an underwater tunnel. You will then rise up out of the tunnel and take a sharp turn and head into a massive loop, followed by spinning up a hill. If this isn't enough to make you feel sick, then you will enter a tunnel with strobe lights right before coming to a screeching halt at end of the ride. I can't wait for this ride to be finished and open up. It sounds fun and scary, but mostly fun. The Great Leap will be open next summer.

After walking around from coaster to coaster all day, you can get pretty hot. If that's the case, cool down on one of these fun water rides. One I recommend is the Log Rider. You ride inside a rubber log through tunnels, around sharp corners, and down drops of 1,000 feet. I loved the end of the ride; you go under a huge waterfall. In this ride you get wet and splashed a lot.

Another amazing water ride is Raging Rafters. On Raging Rafters you float along a big stream, which includes drop downs, waterfalls, and several tunnels. Some tunnels randomly squirt you with water and other tunnels have animated creatures so it's like watching a show as you pass by. Also on Raging Rafters are several corners with bumpers that bump you from one wall to another as you make the turn.

The last great water slide I want to mention is the Gumball Machine. This ride is like a gumball machine because you go around and around while getting lower to the ground, and then you pop out and get splashed by a waterfall.

I can't wait to come next summer to this amazing place and ride all the rides including the new ride, The Great Leap. I will never forget the day I went to Swirly's. I wish I could live there and never leave. I love amusement parks, especially Swirly's. This was the best summer ever.
