





Mutation of the Zombie Pathogen

During what may become the Zombie Apocalypse, it is important to speculate about what may happen in the future and what humanity should prepare for. We never know what may happen to this mysterious pathogen, so considering all possibilities is a must.

Something that is important for scientists to consider is the possibility of mutation. Next to nothing is known about this pathogen, so nothing is known about how it will mutate. I say will because in the common diseases we see the virus or bacterium mutate in order to survive what antibiotics are thrown at them. The most well-known example of this is the case of the common cold. While not a threatening illness, the cold mutates so often that a cure or an antibiotic can't be manufactured.

How this disease spreads is also a mystery. A bite carries it obviously, but is that the only way? With the mutation, the way the disease is contracted may also change. A touch or a scratch may start to carry the substance needed for the disease to live in. A possibility is that the virus may mutate in order to survive and become airborne or contaminate the water supplies of makeshift communities.

Simple zombies are almost everywhere. These are the creatures that stay where they are without moving, sometimes for years if they are in the middle of nowhere, and only seem to move if it is necessary or if they smell what they consider food. These creatures are simple to avoid, and relatively easy to dispatch if needed.

When the virus mutates, it may create different kinds of zombies. They could be more intelligent and start to hunt in large packs in order to overpower the victim. They could learn how to open doors in order to get inside buildings that were once safe.

The pathogen could make them stronger, so they may breach barriers that were strong enough for simple zombies, but are no longer sufficient. It would be easier for zombies to overpower groups of people with fewer of their numbers.

Zombies may eventually regain some of their motor skills and start running or becoming more coordinated. They may figure out how to do other simple things like use locks or use the environment to their advantage. This change seems unlikely, though, as the disease severely damages the brain.

The disease may also affect the zombies' bodies in other physical ways. Their attributes such as hands and fingers could change in order to improve hunting skills. Their legs could elongate in order to move faster. We never know what may happen due to this virus.

One thing that could potentially be a good thing the disease could cause is an accelerated rate of decay. This means that there would still be zombies around, at least until their tendons and muscles rot. The decay could cause the zombies to literally fall apart in a shorter amount of time. On the opposite side of the spectrum, they could start to decay slower and stick around much longer than expected.


Something disastrous that could also happen is the animals of the world becoming susceptible to the same virus as humans. You would have to constantly watch out for silent animals sneaking up on you. In the night there would be nocturnal animals out that are built to be able to hunt when it is dark out.

Even insects and bugs may become diseased, in which case there would be little hope. They can slip into our houses even now, and are little more than nuisances. Imagine having to watch out for these small creatures all day every day! Fortunately, it seems likely that the disease would tear the


small animals and bugs apart from the inside out. They simply probably would not be able to handle the disease inside them.


In one more scenario that is highly unlikely, yet still possible, is the strain mutating to affect plant life. The plants would not necessarily exhibit the classic signs of being a zombie, but would be in the state of dead but not dead. They may leech nutrients from the plants and life around them, instead of just from the dirt around their roots. If it is a plant that other animals and people depend on for food, it would probably either be rotten from the plant leeching nutrients from it, or it would not be there due to stunted growth from the disease. If the food was still there, it probably would not be safe to eat because it may carry the disease. Again, it is highly unlikely for this to happen because the plant would probably just die, but considering all possibilities is important.

Some of the scenarios mentioned in this article may seem far-fetched or extremely unlikely, but nothing is impossible and no possibility should be counted out.

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Epic Brain Recipe

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 brain
- 1 cup-spit
- ¼ cup- ground gravel
- 2 cups- worms of your choice
- 1 cup- motor oil
- 1 cup- melted rubber
- 2 8oz can of spam
- 1-3/8 inch wrench
- ½ cup- candy of your choice



First, preheat your oven to 350°F. Then, take the brain and slice it lengthwise into about ½ inch slices. Place the slices in a large pan over a layer of worms. Next, melt the rubber and add the spit and spam. Let this sit for 7 minutes at a low simmer. Pour this mixture over the brain and place the wrench and candy on top. Finally, put the pan in the oven for 25 to 30 minutes. Once out of the oven, drizzle the oil and sprinkle the gravel generously over the finished dish. 






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
