
So in the end, Wonder Dog won and all was won back in the hearts of the Old York citizens. Wonder Dog still protects his city and restores the peace to the people of Old York.

Training Your Dog Like a Pro

Training dogs has always been a difficult task for humans. Dogs are man's best friend, and this article will teach people how to make sure the dog turns out, as man's best friend.

The first step in training a dog is to start out while the dog is a young pup. The younger the dogs are the more likely behaving well will be implemented in their life. "You can't train an old dog to do new tricks." Many dogs listen when they are younger because they are frightened, but scaring dogs is never fun. With this new technique you always bring the dog to the place he is desired to go.

The next step to training your dog like a pro is, being his best friend. Cuddling, petting, and talking to your dog, tells him how much he is loved. Making sure he doesn't behave poorly for attention is the reason for this crucial step. Never, ever use physical punishment. This will break any good relationship a dog and its owner had possibly had in the past.

A pet peeve many people have is potty training for puppies. Opening the back door and letting out the puppy is not potty training. Giving a puppy food near rest time such as night will not help; it will only make him need to go to the bathroom. To let the new puppy know where he is supposed to go carry or walk him on his leash. Every month a dog matures the longer he can hold in his waste. Bringing a puppy to his designated area every two to three hours and walking back and forth will let him know what he needs to do. Using a cue word or phrase such has "hurry up", or "let's go" will communicate to him what he needs to do.

When he empties, praise him with a treat, letting him know that you are pleased.

Training new puppies not to bark or yelp, is very helpful to keep ears healthy and relaxed. To make sure a dog knows not to bark, scold him in a loud voice. By being loud it will tell him that he is not the alpha dog. If this method does not work after an extensive time, clamping down on his muzzle softly for one to two seconds is also a good technique.

The last step in training your dog like a pro is teaching him tricks. Teaching your dog neat things like shaking hands and rolling over will assure many more people will like him. Add rewards such as treats and reinforcing tricks by lifting a paw to shake while saying a cue word such as "lift" will reinforce his training.


