## Designing Educator Web Sites: Penelope Miller

Participants will develop basic or apply advanced Web site design skills to create and update an interactive classroom Web site and share ideas and suggestions with colleagues. Sufficient time and training will be provided for participants to utilize Web site editing tools not only to communicate effectively with students and parents but also to challenge students by integrating blended learning activities. Additionally, participants will enhance classroom instruction by linking to recommended Internet resources; creating slideshows, online surveys, and class discussion boards; and embedding audio, video, and other innovative digital learning activities within a dynamic Web site. By the end of the summer academy, participants will have designed and updated a fully functional Web site ready to begin the 2016-2017 school year!
