1.	<u>allegory</u> a short moral story (often with animal characters) that has symbolic or sometimes hidden meaning
2.	<u>character witness</u> a witness who testifies under oath as to the good reputation of another person in the community where that person lives
3.	connotative having the power of implying or suggesting something in addition to what is explicit
4.	dialogue a conversation between two persons
5.	drama a dramatic work intended for performance by actors on a stage
6.	explicit precisely and clearly expressed or readily observable; leaving nothing to implication
7.	figurative (used of the meanings of words or text) not literal; using figures of speech
8.	<u>film noir</u> a movie that is marked by a mood of pessimism, fatalism, menace, and cynical characters
9.	<u>flashback</u> a transition (in literary or theatrical works or films) to an earlier event or scene that interrupts the normal chronological development of the story
10.	genre a kind of literary or artistic work
11.	<u>hero</u> someone who fights for a cause
12.	heroine the main good female character in a work of fiction
13.	<u>humor</u> a message whose ingenuity or verbal skill or incongruity has the power to evoke laughter
14.	<u>implicit</u> implied though not directly expressed; inherent in the nature of something; something that can be inferred
15.	irony incongruity between what might be expected and what actually occurs
16.	<u>literal</u> limited to the explicit meaning of a word or text
17.	monologue a (usually long) dramatic speech by a single actor
18.	mood a characteristic (habitual or relatively temporary) state of feeling
19.	perspective a way of regarding situations or topics etc.

	preconceived notion an opinion formed beforehand without adequate evidence
