Adverbs Fun!

Adverbs modify or describe verbs, other adverbs or adjectives. They answer the questions about the relationship of place, time, manner, and degree.

How?

Examples: suddenly, quickly, fast, easily, quietly, patiently

When?

Examples: yesterday, today, tomorrow, now, often

Where?

Examples: here, there, everywhere, anywhere, nowhere

To What Degree?

How Much?

In What Way?

To What Extent?

Examples: very, quite, rather, extremely, really, too

Many adverbs, but not all, end in the suffix -ly. Some other adverb suffixes are -ward (direction) and -wise (pertaining to)
