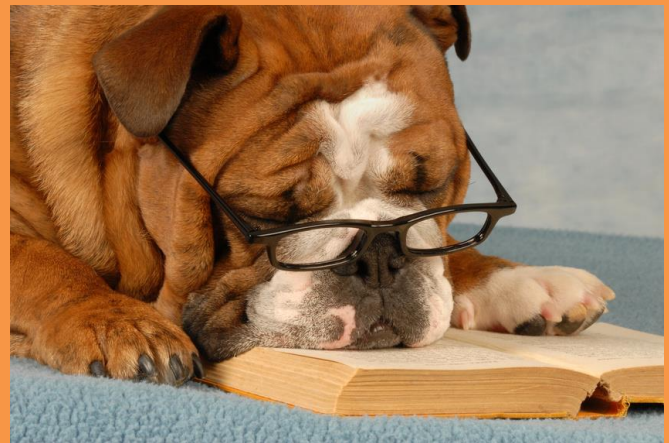
It was a lot of fun making my magazine and if I had an opportunity to it again, I would probably say yes.
