CHARTER SCHOOL CONTRACT BETWEEN THE HORTONVILLE AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE FOX WEST ACADEMY

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- 4 **THIS AGREEMENT** is made by and between the Board of Education of the Hortonville Area School
- District ("HASD"), 246 North Olk Street, P.O. Box 70, WI 54944 and the Fox West Academy 5
- Governance Council ("FWA"), 220 Warner Street, Hortonville, Wisconsin, 54944. WHEREAS, the 6
- 7 Board of Education is authorized pursuant to Wisconsin Statute 118.40(2m)(a), to contract with an
- individual or group to operate a school as a charter school; and, 8
- 9 WHEREAS, the Board of Education wishes to grant to FWA a charter to operate as a charter 10 school pursuant to Wisconsin Statute §118.40(2m)(a),
- 11 **NOW, THEREFORE,** the parties agree as follows:
- 12 1. Definitions.
- 13 When used in this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply: See Examples a. & b.
- 14 "Host School": means a public school in the HASD that allows FWA to use its classrooms and other educational facilities for the purposes of educating FWA's students. 15
 - "Partner School": means a public or private school with which FWA students participate h. in co-curricular activities and student events.

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2. **Establishment.** The person seeking to establish the Charter School is the FWA Governance Council.

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Administrative Services. At its sole cost and expense, HASD will provide administrative **3.** services to support all School District employees and all enrolled pupils at FWA in the same manner as other HASD schools, including but not limited to: purchasing, accounts payable, 24 accounting, bookkeeping, risk management, auditing, cash management, payroll, benefits administration, pupil services, recordkeeping, reporting and other compliance monitoring and fulfillment, building and grounds maintenance, and testing of students. To the extent that HASD requires information maintained only by FWA to complete the reporting and compliance monitoring requirements hereunder, HASD will, no later than June 15 prior to the start of any school year, provide FWA with a list of all information required and FWA will provide full and accurate responses no later than September 1. HASD will at all times remain the sole employer of all personnel engaged in providing administrative services. All services set forth/outlined not in the budget will be provided by the HASD in a like manner as provided to 34 the other schools.

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4. **Instrumentality**. FWA will be an instrumentality of the HASD.

- 5. Educational Program. A description of the educational program of the school and methods used to enable pupils to attain the educational goals under Wis. Stat. § 118.01.
 FWA currently enrolls students in grades 6-8. FWA, in partnership with its community, will provide project based learning opportunities that strengthen each individual learner's unique learning styles, intelligences, and interests. The educational program of FWA will consist of these main features:
 - a. The following elements are central to the vision and mission of the FWA: Integrated curriculum and project based learning; gradual shift of responsibility from teacher-directed to student-selected projects and application of concepts; goal setting and project management skills; differentiation and individualized learning; problem-solving skill development and collaborative learning; development of communication, interpersonal, and leadership skills; partnerships with area community members, businesses, and service organizations; effective utilization of a variety of technologies for communication and use as learning
 - b. Project based learning is foundational to the school's curriculum. Individualized projects that are teacher guided accommodate students' unique learning styles, needs, and interests. They provide students with choice, allow them to draw upon their strengths, apply knowledge and skills acquired through direct instruction. Central to the project based curriculum will be a problem solving framework that will guide students through the process from start to finish.
 - c. The core content areas of reading, language, math, science, and social studies will serve as a vehicle for students to attain the identified learning outcomes. In addition to the core content areas, students will be provided learning opportunities in exploratories art, music, physical education, health, and world languages. 21st century skills and literacy will be emphasized and integrated throughout the content areas. Science, technology, the principles of engineering, and math (STEM) will be one focus of the school's integrated curriculum. This integrated approach to content learning has numerous benefits such as facilitating the development of process skills, engaging learners and increasing rigor and relevance.
 - d. Student use of technology will be standard practice for the purpose of researching and gathering information, managing data, completing assignment/projects, and sharing and presenting findings. Daily access to technology will help us become resource flexible. This emphasis on technology will require instruction in topics surrounding digital/media literacy.
 - e. Leadership development will also be a central aspect supported through advisory groups and instructional lessons covering Sean Covey's 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens. Opportunities to apply learned skills and habits through presentation nights and projects are valued and a priority.
 - f. Students will be provided with opportunities to learn beyond the walls of the classroom through field experiences.

- Methods of Measuring Student Progress.
 FWA shall use the following local measures, assessments and standardized tests to measure pupil progress. Staff meets regularly during the school year to retrieve and analyze data. This information is used to develop school improvement action plans based on goals.
 - a. FWA shall achieve a percentage of pupils enrolled in FWA scoring proficient or advanced on State Assessments in the area of reading and mathematics that is comparable to the district averages for the corresponding subjects of same-age peers.
 - b. FWA shall achieve a percentage of pupils enrolled in FWA scoring proficient or advanced on District Assessments in the area of reading and mathematics that is comparable to the district averages for the corresponding subjects of same-age peers.

7. <u>Governance Structure.</u>

- a. <u>Governance Council</u>. A Governance Council consisting of staff, parents, and community members will govern the school (the "FWA Governance Council"). The FWA Governance Council shall oversee the operational, financial, educational, and collaborative aspects of the Charter School for the purpose of supporting the mission of FWA.
- b. <u>Teacher Team</u>. Daily administration of FWA will be the responsibility of the FWA staff working in a collaborative team approach with the FWA Principal. The teacher team will coordinate and oversee the daily operation of the school and will work closely with the FWA Governance Council to ensure that the educational goals of the school are met. Communications from HASD needed for procedural purposes will go to the FWA team of teachers, as well as the FWA Principal. The FWA team of teachers will designate a Lead Teacher to serve on the Building Leadership Team of the Host School.
- c. <u>Principal</u>. A principal will be assigned to FWA by HASD. The FWA principal will demonstrate an interest and a commitment to the students as well as the mission and vision of the school. The FWA principal will be appropriately licensed.
- d. Governance Council Constitution. Other than issues specifically addressed in this agreement regarding the FWA Governance Council, the size, method of appointment and constitution of the FWA Governance Council will be as stipulated in the FWA Governance Council's by-laws. Total membership of the FWA Governance Council shall be comprised of fewer than 50% HASD employees. FWA School administrators and HASD Board of Education members will not serve on the FWA Governance Council.
- e. <u>Officers</u>. Election of officers is detailed in the by-laws of the FWA Governance Council.
- f. Meetings. The FWA Governance Council will hold a minimum of 8 meetings throughout the year, with one being an annual meeting. A quorum, consisting of a majority of the Voting Members of the FWA Governance Council must be present before business can be transacted. A majority vote of the Voting Members then serving is sufficient for any action, including election of Council Officers. Meetings are open to

all staff, parents, students, and community members and participation on standing committees is encouraged.

g. <u>Program Evaluation</u>

FWA will regularly assess its practices and procedures to ensure its program of services is dynamic, developing, and of value to the students it serves. Continued improvement and innovations are central to implementing charter schools that provide meaningful educational options for students who are living in a rapidly changing society. Student progress will be assessed both formally and informally; achievement data collected will be collected and analyzed to help identify and guide program improvement plans. The FWA Governance Council will approve building budget plans in accordance with determined program development needs. Additional funds will be sought by the FWA Governance Council to sustain training and materials supporting improvement and innovation through grants, donations, and fundraising.

- h. <u>Annual Report</u>. FWA will produce an Annual Report for the Governance Council and will make this document available to the Board of Education and community upon request. The Annual Report will include:
 - (1) State testing results
 - (2) Local measures testing results
 - (3) Enrollment data
 - (4) Attendance data
 - (5) Student academic progress
 - (6) Financial report

8. Parental and Community Involvement.

Parents/guardians will have several opportunities to be involved in the FWA.

- a. Parent and community involvement is an essential component of FWA. Opportunities for involvement in FWA include representation on the Governance Council, committee involvement, special activities, and volunteer opportunities to help in the classroom.
- b. Parents will receive mid-quarter and quarterly reports on student progress at FWA. Parent-teacher conferences will be held according to district schedules. Additional parent teacher conferences, electronic mail, print correspondence, and telephone contacts will be used on an individual basis to communicate student progress when the parents, or teachers, feel it is appropriate.
- c. Students from the 6th through 8th grades will: have email accounts assigned by FWA; be able to post podcasts and webcasts, create blogs, and fully utilize available technology under the supervision and website administration of FWA teachers. Further, FWA will be considered a separate entity for the implementation of, and student access to, programs such as, but not limited to: Edmodo, Google Docs, apps, sites, and programs.

9. <u>Faculty Qualifications.</u>

- a. Describe qualifications: Individuals who have a desire to teach at FWA will be teachers who are appropriately licensed. The positions will be posted to indicate that candidates should demonstrate an interest and a commitment to the unique mission and vision of the school. Applicants should also have knowledge or a desire to acquire knowledge in project based learning.
- b. Teachers who work at FWA will be employees of the Hortonville Area School District and will be entitled to all rights and privileges afforded other teachers in the district. Salary and benefits will be structured according to the Teacher Handbook as established by the HASD Board of Education.
- c. When charter school vacancies or additional staffing needs occur, the FWA Governance Council will collaborate with HASD to assist with the hiring process. The FWA Governance Council will designate a representative to serve on the interviewing team that helps make final recommendations to the District Administrator of the Board. Office of the District Administrator or HASD will verify an applicant's credentials and background prior to hiring. Staff evaluations will be conducted by the District administrators. In addition to the administrative evaluations other staff assessments may be utilized such My Learning Plan.

10. Student Health and Safety. All state and local health and safety regulations and building code standards will be followed at all HASD locations at which FWA may be located. In addition, the health and safety policies applicable to all other non-charter schools in the HASD shall apply equally to FWA.

11. Recruitment and Means of Achieving Racial/Ethnic Balance

- a. FWA prohibits discrimination and will not discriminate on the basis of age, handicap, marital or parental status, national origin pregnancy, race, religion, sex, or sexual orientation or any other classification protected by law. FWA official non-discrimination policy will be applied in all operations. Access to FWA will also not be restricted or enhanced by the following: family income, academic performance, English language proficiency, or athletic ability. Equal access will be provided to all students.
- b. FWA will monitor the demographic make-up of the student population. If specific groups are under-represented, outreach efforts will be further customized to raise awareness and generate interest.

12. Admission Requirements.

- a. FWA is open to all students of the HASD as well as students applying through the Wisconsin Inter-District Open Enrollment process.
- b. Any student wishing to attend FWA may make application according to timelines published. Applications will be available on the FWA website or by request at the

- Hortonville Area School District middle schools, and Hortonville Area School District
 Office. A parent/guardian is encouraged to attend one informational meeting or visit
 FWA in order to assure understanding of the nature and work of the school. Acceptance
 of an application is not affected by failure to attend this informational meeting.
 - c. If the number of applicants exceeds available positions, a lottery will be employed. The names of students on the waiting list will be recorded in the order in which they were drawn. The waiting list does not roll over from year to year. Application procedures and lottery explanations shall be posted on the FWA's website once applications are made available.
 - d. Exemptions from the lottery shall be granted to students currently attending FWA, siblings of students currently attending FWA, and children of the founding members of FWA. Founding members include staff, FWA Governance Council members, and Committee Chairpersons involved in the planning phase and first year of the original charter contract.
 - e. Students may enroll and attend FWA at any point during the school year as space permits in accordance with these guidelines and procedures.

13. Budget Responsibilities of HASD and the Charter School.

- a. <u>Equal Funding</u>: As an instrumentality, the HASD will be responsible for salaries and benefits of staff, as well as the associated expenses of the FWA space. Not later than April 1 of each year during the term of this Contract, the District shall provide FWA with an operational budget consistent with the per student building budgets for the other District middle schools. FWA shall then submit a plan for the expenditure of said funds showing the District its best estimate of proposed total expenditures for administering the Contract during the upcoming fiscal period of July 1 to June 30. Operational funds shall be available to FWA at the same time and in the same manner they are made available to other schools within the District.
 - The Charter School shall be eligible to receive IT services(computer rotations, repairs, student support services, library services, testing/assessment services and other professional development related to District initiatives ie. Balanced Literacy training services made available to the schools in the District, with the distribution of such resources to be determined in a manner consistent with the distribution of such resources to other programs in the District not part of FWA operational budget. FWA will be provided services and resources not funded by building budgets consistent with per student services and resources.
- b. <u>Purchases</u>: Tangible materials/equipment purchased by FWA with grants or donor dollars will be the joint property of the charter school and the HASD and will be labeled as such. If said materials/equipment purchased become outdated or inoperable, it will be the FWA's responsibility to maintain and/or replace this material/equipment according to the district's specifications with its building budget, grants, or donations.
- c. <u>Personnel</u>: FWA enrollments will not exceed 1:20. Therefore, an enrollment of 60 students will require 3.0 FTE. Increases above 60 students would require additional space and staffing.

d. <u>Administration</u>: Administrative services will be provided in the same manner as other HASD schools, including but not limited to: accounting, bookkeeping, risk management, auditing, cash management, payroll, benefits, administrations, labor relations, enrollment pupil services, record keeping, and general testing of students.

- e. <u>Curriculum</u>: Instruction resources to support the curriculum and school vision will be evaluated and selected based upon their capacity to address student learning outcomes. They may include and expand upon current District approved instructional materials. A quality curriculum at FWA will be sustained through HASD textbook replacement/adoption funds. Other expense incurred through the curriculum development process will be offset by alternate sources of funding, i.e. those not covered in technology upgrades or other curricular purchases.
- f. <u>Liability Insurance</u>: As an instrumentality of the HASD, the FWA will fall under the umbrella of the HASD's liability insurance.
- g. <u>Co-curricular Activities</u>: All FWA students may participate in Co-curricular activities available at the Partner School. These activities will be offset by current District allocations and other funding sources. FWA reserves the rights to create new co-curricular options for its students.
- h. <u>Food Services</u>: Food service will be provided through the HASD's food service program assigned to the school's facility.
- i. <u>Pupil Services</u>: Pupil services will be provided through HASD staff assigned to the school's facility.
- j. <u>Custodial Services</u>: Custodial and maintenance services will be provided by the HASD at the school's facility.
- k. <u>Testing and Assessment</u>: State and Federal testing and assessment that is administered by the HASD will be the same for FWA students as is for students at other HASD schools. Testing will occur at the FWA school site and necessary technology requirements required for assessment purposes will be provided by the HASD.
- 1. <u>Health and Safety</u>: FWA will follow all health and safety guidelines, policies and rules, established, now or in the future, by HASD. This will include, but is not limited to, staff development and training, conducting fire drills, severe weather shelter drills, development of a building security plan, and addressing cleanliness of the site and classrooms. FWA shall also comply with all Applicable Laws.
- m. <u>Grant Applications</u>. The FWA shall comply with District procedures for the preparation and submission of grant applications and submit to the Office copies of any applications for grants made on behalf of the Charter School at the time the application is submitted to the funding authority.
- n. <u>Special Education Services.</u> Special needs of students will be met according to the goals of their IEP. The HASD will provide needed special education services as appropriate.

289 14. Student Behavior and Discipline Model.

FWA will use positive behavior intervention strategies outlined by the PBIS framework of the Host School PBIS team. Suspensions of FWA students will be made by the Principal in collaboration with the FWA staff consistent with current District policies.

15. Public School Alternatives. No student will be required to attend FWA. Students, who do not elect to attend FWA, may attend a school within the HASD in conformance with the enrollment policy of the HASD Board of Education.

Tuition. FWA shall not charge any tuition. The FWA may assess reasonable pupil fees in accordance with District policies for activities such as field trips and extracurricular activities, which shall not exceed the actual cost to provide such activities. The FWA may not, however, prohibit an enrolled pupil from attending the Charter School, or expel or otherwise discipline such pupil, or withhold or reduce the pupil's grades because the pupil has not paid fees permissibly charged under this section.

Audits. The HASD usual and annual audit will include FWA. The scope of the annual audit will be determined by the HASD and conducted at the expense of the HASD. FWA will participate in all financial audits and comply with all audit procedures and requirements of the HASD audit team as contracted by the HASD Board of Education.

In conformance with the "Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 39," funds provided by or procured from FWA as an instrumentality and component unit of the HASD are subject to the HASD fiscal accounting procedures, including audits, and will be included in the HASD financial statements as determined by the HASD audit team as contracted by the HASD Board of Education.

18. School Facilities and Liability Insurance.

- a. <u>Facilities.</u> FWA is currently located at 220 Warner Street, Hortonville, Wisconsin. The HASD will ensure that the building(s) in which the Charter School program is located meet(s) all building codes and other building requirements for a public school facility.
- b. <u>Liability Insurance.</u> The HASD shall insure all ordinary and reasonably foreseeable risks related to operation of FWA including liability, property, worker's compensation, errors and omissions, and comprehensive coverage.

19. Indemnification and Limitation on Liability.

- a. Indemnification of District.
 - 1) Subject to the limitations and immunities set forth in section 893.80 of the Wisconsin Statutes and all similar laws, to the extent applicable under law, FWA Governance Council agrees to indemnify, defend and hold HASD and its Board of Education, officers, administrators, agents and employees harmless

from and against, any and all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, reasonable actual attorneys' fees and expenses) and damages (collectively, "Losses") arising out of any "Indemnity Claim," which means any action, cause of action, suit, proceeding, claim, or demand of any third party that, if true, would establish:

- a) Breach by FWA of any provision of this Agreement;
- b) Failure by FWA Governance Council to comply with all applicable law, relating to this Agreement or operation of FWA, and state and/or federal laws concerning the establishment or operation of a charter school, or identification, admission, access, and/or evaluation of, and/or provision of services and/or accommodations to and/or prohibition of discrimination against students or employees with known or suspected disabilities or any other discrimination as prohibited by applicable law against students or employees; or
- Any negligent or willful act or omission of FWA Governance Council, or its employees or agents in connection with the performance of the obligations of FWA Governance Council under this Agreement. The obligation of FWA Governance Council., to indemnify and hold harmless under this subsection 19 with respect to any Indemnity Claim will be reduced to the comparative extent, as established by a judgment entered in a court of competent jurisdiction after any appeals, that such Indemnity Claim arises out of acts of fraud, willful misconduct, or acts in breach of this Agreement on the part of HASD or its Board of Education, officers, administrators, agents and employees. The obligations set forth in this subsection 19, survive the termination of this Agreement.

b. Indemnification of the Fox West Academy Governance Council

- 1) Subject to the limitations and immunities set forth in section 893.80 of the Wisconsin Statues and all similar laws, to the extent applicable under law, HASD agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the FWA Governance Council and its directors, officers, agents and employees harmless from and against, any and all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, actual reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) and damages (collectively, "Losses") arising out of any "Indemnity Claim," which means any action, cause of action, suit, proceeding, claim, or demand of any third party that, if true, would establish:
 - a) Breach by HASD of any provision of this Agreement; or
 - b) Any negligent or willful act or omission of HASD, the HASD Board of Education or its employees or agents in connection with the performance of the obligations of HASD under this Agreement.

The obligation of HASD to indemnify and hold harmless under this subsection 19 with respect to any Indemnity Claim will be reduced to the comparative extent, as established by a judgment entered in a court of competent jurisdiction after any appeals,

- that such Indemnity Claim arises out of acts of fraud, willful misconduct, or acts in breach of this Agreement on the part of the FWA Governance Council or its agents and employees. The obligations set forth in this section 19 survive the termination of this Agreement.
 - c. <u>Indemnification Procedure</u>. Any Party entitled to indemnification under this Section 19 (each an "Indemnified Party") agrees to give the Party required to indemnify such Party hereunder (each an "Indemnifying Party") prompt written notice of any Indemnity Claim as to which it intends to request indemnification hereunder. The Indemnifying Party will have the right to direct, through counsel of its own choosing, the defense or settlement of any Indemnity Claim at its own expense. The Indemnified Party may participate in such defense at its own expense.
 - d. If the Indemnifying Party fails to defend or, if after commencing or undertaking any such defense, fails to prosecute or withdraws from such defense, the Indemnified Party will have the right to undertake the defense or settlement thereof, at the Indemnifying Party's expense. If the Indemnified Party assumes the defense of any such Indemnity Claim pursuant to this section 19 and proposes to settle such Indemnity Claim prior to a final judgment thereon or to forego any appeal with respect thereto, then the Indemnified Party will give the Indemnifying Party prompt written notice thereof and the Indemnifying Party will have the right to participate in the settlement or assume or reassume the defense of such Indemnity Claim. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Section 19 to the contrary, the Indemnifying Party will not, without the prior written consent of the Indemnified Party (which consent will not be unreasonably withheld or delayed), agree to a settlement of any such Indemnity Claim.
 - e. <u>Limitation of Indemnity by HASD</u>. The obligation of HASD to indemnify FWA is limited by the provisions of 893.80 of the Wisconsin Statutes to the full extent such statue affords limitation or immunities to HASD, HASD not intending to waive any such provisions.

20. Non-Sectarian Status. FWA shall be non-sectarian in its programs, admissions, policies, employment practices and all other operations.

21. Term, Renewal and Termination of this Contract.

- a. <u>Term.</u> Consistent with the provisions of §118.40(3)(b), Wis. Stats., the term of this Contract ("Term") shall be for five (5) years commencing on the first day of the 2016-2017 school year, and shall expire at midnight, on June 30, 2021, unless terminated or extended pursuant to the terms hereof.
- b. <u>Renewal.</u> Pursuant to §118.40(3)(b), Wis. Stats., upon expiration of the initial Term, the HASD Board of Education and FWA may mutually agree to renew this Contract for such additional terms for up to five (5) years each as the Boards of the HASD and FWA deem appropriate.
- c. <u>Termination by Board of Education.</u> This Contract may be terminated by the HASD Board of Education if it finds that:

414 (1) FWA has insufficient enrollment to successfully operate a charter school; 415 FWA has violated this Contract; (2) If FWA fails to comply with generally accepted accounting principles and 416 (3) 417 standards of fiscal management; If the students of FWA have not shown sufficient academic progress as 418 (4) 419 determined by state and local measures as indicated in Section 6; 420 If students enrolled in FWA have failed to make sufficient progress toward (5) 421 attaining the educational goals of their curriculum. If an extension of time to attain such goals is requested by the FWA Governance Board and/or 422 Administration in writing, such request shall include a written plan acceptable to 423 424 the HASD. This plan will set out the additional steps FWA will take to attain such educational goals within a reasonable timeframe. If the HASD Board 425 accepts the written plan, or a modified plan, FWA shall be allowed a reasonable 426 time in which to correct the progress deficiencies; 427 428 (6) The FWA Governance Council, Council Members, employees, or agents 429 provide the HASD Board of Education false or intentionally misleading information or documentation in the performance of this Contract; 430 FWA has failed materially to comply with Applicable Law; 431 (7) 432 (8) Any director, members, employee, or agent of FWA has knowingly violated any statute, ordinance or Board policy with respect to the operation of the Charter 433 434 School: 435 (9) FWA knowingly violates Section 118.40 of the Wisconsin Statutes governing charter schools: 436 437 (10)FWA defaults materially in any of the terms, conditions, promises or representations contained in or incorporated into this Contract. 438 439 d. Notice. Written notice of such termination shall be provided to the FWA via certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, and shall include the stated reasons for the 440 441 termination and its effective date. The HASD will issue a provisional notice of termination on or before July 1 to be effective the subsequent July 1. During the 442 interim school year, the HASD may require that FWA undertake corrective and 443 remedial actions identified by the HASD. Termination of this Contract may be 444 445 suspended by HASD upon compliance by FWA with the corrective and remedial measures identified by the HASD. Unless otherwise suspended, the provisional notice 446 of termination will be effective on the date set forth in the provisional notice. In the 447 event of termination, materials and equipment purchased with HASD funds of any 448 character will remain the property of HASD. Funds raised by non-school groups 449 through fundraising activities and directed to individual schools or school organizations, 450 451 shall be considered gifts to the district and all gifts and bequests shall become property

Emergency Termination or Suspension. If the HASD Board of Education determines

that any of the causes for termination set forth in Section c., above, have occurred and

HASD reasonably determines that the health or safety of the students of FWA is put at

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- actual risk thereby, the HASD Board of Education shall provide FWA written notice of such cause for termination and, upon delivering such notice, (i) may either terminate this Contract immediately or (ii) may exercise superintending control of FWA pending further action.
 - f. <u>Termination by the Fox West Academy Governance Council</u>. This Contract may be terminated by FWA Governance Board if FWA finds that any of the following have occurred:
 - (1) FWA has insufficient enrollment to successfully operate a public school;
 - (2) HASD willfully provides FWA false or intentionally misleading information or documentation in the performance of this Contract, or
 - (3) HASD defaults materially in any of the terms, conditions, promises or representations contained in or incorporated into this Contract.

FWA shall provide notice of termination effective June 30 of any year upon written notice to the Board of Education prior to February 31. When FWA asserts a material default on the part of the HASD, FWA will provide written notice of the specific material default asserted and afford the HASD 60 calendar days in which to cure the asserted material default.

- g. <u>Final Accounting</u>. Upon termination of this Contract, FWA shall assist the HASD Board of Education in conducting a final accounting of FWA by making available to the HASD Board of Education all books and records that have been reviewed in preparing FWA annual audits and statements under Section 17 of this Contract.
- h. <u>Equipment Disposition</u>. FWA will respond to requests from the HASD Board of Education and Department of Public Instruction for inventory of equipment purchased with state or federal funds, including federal charter school funds, and the disposition of any individual item of equipment worth \$300 or more.

22. Autonomy.

- a. FRA will be exempt from all state educational laws and policies to which it is entitled to exemption in the Wisconsin State Charter School law (Wisconsin Statute §118.40).
- b. Particularly, the Fox West Academy and the FWA Governance Council will have autonomy related to:
 - 1) District Policy 2210 Curriculum Development/Approval/Evaluation Process
- **23. Transportation**. The District will not provide transportation to FWA students from outside the district. When the charter is part of a HASD campus that has daily bus service, in-district students may ride their assigned bus to FWA. FWA will be able to use District transportation in a manner consistent with other schools and programs in the District

All prior applications, agreements or 540 contracts, representations, statements, negotiations, understandings and undertakings 541 are superseded by this Contract.
 - d. <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Contract is held to be invalid or unenforceable, it shall be ineffective only to the extent of the invalidity, without affecting or impairing the validity and enforceability of the remainder of the provisions of this Contract. If any provision of this Contract shall be or be determined to be in violation of any federal, state or local law, such provision shall be considered null and void, and all other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
 - e. <u>Modifications.</u> No modification to this Contract shall be effective unless the same is in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties. During any year of this Contract, either party may request to amend a provision of this Agreement. A request for amendment will be presented in writing before March 30 of each year and identify the terms of the proposed amendment. Thereafter, the parties will promptly meet and confer in good faith with respect to the proposed amendment. Neither party shall be obligated to accept any request for amendment. Any amendment which is agreed upon will be effective July 1 or on such other date as the parties may agree.
 - f. Assignment. This Contract is not assignable.

g. <u>Counterparts: Signature by Facsimile.</u> This Contract may be signed in counterparts, which shall together constitute the signed original Contract. A signature delivered by facsimile or electronic mail shall be considered an original for purpose of this Contract.
