# Types of Check Outs



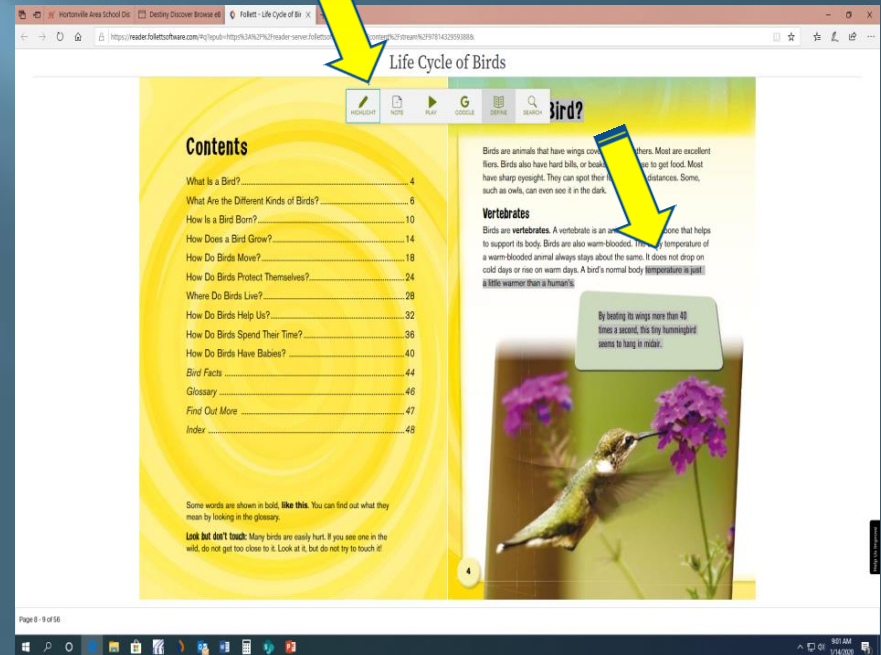
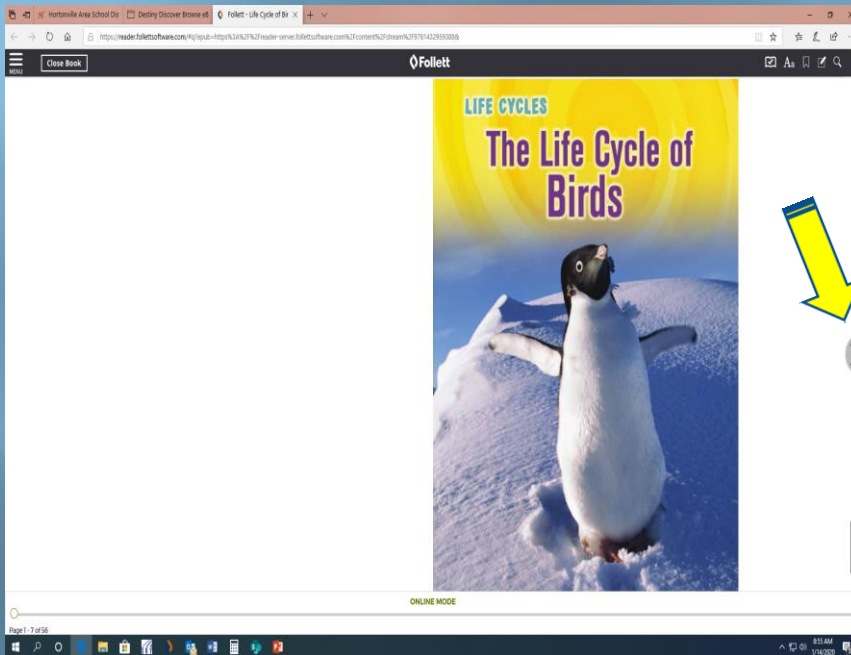

# Example of an eBook

THE BOOK WILL OPEN TO THE COVER.

TURN THE PAGES BY PRESSING THE ARROW KEY UNTIL YOU COME TO THE FIRST PAGE OF WRITING.

YOU CAN HIGHLIGHT PASSAGES BY CLICKING AND HOLDING DOWN UNTIL THE HIGHLIGHT STARTS, THEN DRAG UNTIL THE END OF WHAT YOU WANT TO HIGHLIGHT.



# Highlight to look up word definitions in the dictionary

DOUBLE CLICK ON THE WORD TO HIGHLIGHT IT.  
CLICK ON "DEFINE" FOR THE DICTIONARY.

WHEN YOU OPEN THE DICTIONARY, IT WILL NORMALLY GIVE YOU DEFINITIONS UNLESS IT IS NOT IN THE FOLLETT DICTIONARY.

Life Cycle of Birds

**Bird?**

Birds are animals that have wings covered with feathers. Most are excellent fliers. Birds also have hard bills, or beaks, that they use to get food. Most have sharp eyesight. They can spot their food at great distances. Some, such as owls, can even see it in the dark.

**Vertebrates**

Birds are **vertebrates**. A vertebrate is an animal with a backbone that helps to support its body. Birds are also warm-blooded. The body temperature of a warm-blooded animal always stays about the same. It does not drop on cold days or rise on warm days. A bird's normal body **temperature is just a little warmer than a human's**.

By beating its wings more than 40 times a second, this tiny hummingbird seems to hang in midair.

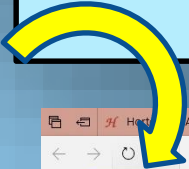
